

This is the fourth and final installment in a series about the environmental views of candidates for major office in California. (The others covered Meg Whitman, Jerry Brown, and Boxer's opponent Carly Fiorina.) Boxer's environmental views are easy to summarize: she's very green. The contrast between Boxer and Fiorina on environmental issues is stark - even greater than the difference between Brown and Whitman.
