Say what you want about environmental lawyers: We know how to pick a conference locale. This year's conference runs from Oct. 25-28, with keynote addresses from Matt Rodriquez, California Secretary for Environmental Protection; Chris Lehnertz, Regional Director with the National Park Service; adventurer Rick Ridgeway; and John Laird, California's Secretary for Natural Resources.
