



THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT *at* 40
Examining Its Past and Exploring Its Future

This Friday, October 4th, the U.C. Davis School of Law’s California Environmental Law & Policy Center (CELPC) will convene a major conference commemorating the 40th anniversary of the federal Endangered Species Act. “The ESA at 40: Examining Its Past and Exploring Its Future” will bring to King Hall a broad array of ESA experts, including government policymakers, scientists, economists and academics.

Keynoting the all-day conference will be former U.S. Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt and former Administrator of the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration Dr. Jane Lubchenco. Other featured speakers include Counselor to the Assistant U.S. Secretary of the Interior for Fish & Wildlife Michael Bean; President and CEO of Defenders of Wildlife Jamie Clark; Pacific Legal Foundation Principal Attorney Damien Schiff; Center for Biological Diversity Senior Counsel Kassie Siegel; and Law Professors (and ESA scholars) John Leshy, Holly Doremus, Al Lin and Chris Wold.
