I am happy to share the news that California Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon (D-Los Angeles) has named fellow Legal Planet blogger Ann Carlson, Shirley Shapiro Professor of Environmental Law and co-director of the <a href="Emmett Institute on Climate Change and the Environment">Emmett Institute on Climate Change and the Environment</a>, to serve on California's Independent Emissions Market Advisory Committee.
