*Scientific American*'s <u>60-Second Science blog</u> is reporting, picking up on a news story from <u>Science</u>, that last year's devastating earthquake in southern China may have been caused by the filling of an enormous reservoir behind a dam built in 2004. The weight of the water in that reservoir, located just over 3 miles from the quake's epicenter, may have increased stress on the nearby fault enough to trigger its rupture. The Chinese government denies any connection.
